

Bike Month 2021 Contest (“Contest”) Rules and Regulations (“Rules”)

Rules and Regulations

- 1.** In order to be eligible to win, an entrant must: (i) if 18 years of age or older complete and submit the Adult Entry Form; or (ii) if entrant is under 18 years of age, the entrant’s parent or guardian complete and submit the Youth Entry Form together with a photo of only the entrant with one (1) of the five (5) types of cycling facilities described in these Rules. Entrants may submit up to 5 Entries per household. Each Entry must include a photo of the entrant with a different type of cycling facility described in these Rules (e.g. 1 photo of the participant on a trail = 1 entry, 1 photo of the participant using a multi-use path = 1 entry). Adult Entry Forms and Youth Entry Forms collectively known as “Entries.” Entries are to be submitted online to Madeleine.Myhill@guelph.ca during the Contest Period. The sole determinate of time for the purposes of receipt of a qualifying Entry will be the City’s computer servers. Proof of transmission (screen shots, captures etc.) does not constitute proof of receipt. The City reserves the right to verify the eligibility of the potential winners.
- 2.** No purchase necessary. Limit five (5) Entries per household.
- 3.** The Contest starts on June 2, 2021 at 8 a.m. (EDT) and ends on June 30, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. (EDT) (“Contest Period”).
- 4.** Entries become the property of the City and will not be returned.
- 5.** The City may, in its sole discretion, disqualify any Entry that:
 - Is incomplete, illegible, damaged or irregular;
 - Was submitted by illicit means; or
 - Does not conform with or satisfy these Rules.
- 6.** This Contest is open to all residents of Guelph, Ontario, of any age except for elected officials of the City, and members of their immediate family living in the same household with an elected official of the City, or employee of the City and members of their immediate family living in the same household with an employee of the City.
- 7.** Entries will be entered into a draw and winners will be selected at random. City staff will draw qualifying Entries to win the prize from all eligible Entries received by the City on Monday, July 5, 2021 in Guelph, Ontario, and will notify the winners by e-mail. Winning entrants will have until July 12, 2021 to contact the City and claim their prize, at which time another name will be drawn.
- 8.** There will be a total of thirteen (13) prizes:
 - First Prize: 1 Bike [Comprehensive Tune-up](#) from Speed River Bicycle (approximate value \$124.99)

- Second Prize: 1 Bike [Gold Tune-up](#) from Paramount Sports (approximate value \$119.50)
- Third Prize: 10 prizes each of \$100 Downtown Dollars Gift Certificate from Downtown Guelph Business Association for [select stores, restaurants or beauty services](#) (excludes some professional services such as lawyers, RMT's etc.) offered in the downtown Guelph boundary
- Fourth Prize: 1 Bike Speedy Tune-up from BackPeddling (approximate value \$99.00)

10. Prizes must be accepted as awarded and are non-refundable, non-transferable and non-redeemable for any cash value subject to availability and no warranties, guarantees or representations are implied or expressed. The City reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to substitute any prize with a prize of equivalent value. Limit one (1) prize per household.

11. Chances of winning depend on the number of eligible Entries received.

12. Winning entrant must: (i) provide proof of identity and if winning entrant is under the age of 18 then provide entrant's parent or guardian consent to claim the prize; (ii) correctly answer a skill testing question; and (iii) sign and return to the City a release, releasing the City, its representatives, agents, employees and members of Council, from any liability in connection with this Contest or the prize as a condition to, and in advance of, receiving the prize. If a winning entrant is under the age of 18, then the prize will be awarded in the name of the minor's parent or legal guardian who will be responsible for fulfilling all of the requirements of this Contest or another entrant may be elected for the prize at the City's sole discretion. If a selected entrant cannot be confirmed as a winner as above, the City may, at its sole discretion, disqualify the entrant and select another winning entrant, in the same manner as set out herein.

13. Each entrant agrees to abide by all Rules. If there is any doubt as to the eligibility of an entrant or the manner in which an entrant wins a prize, the City, in its sole discretion, will decide the issue and their decision will be final. Entrants using any scheme, information or method to win a prize which, in the sole opinion of the City, is other than a fair chance, will be disqualified and lose the right to claim a prize to which they otherwise would have been entitled. If after the awarding of the Contest prize a Contest winner is disqualified or determined to be ineligible, an alternate winner will be selected using the same process described above. Alternate winners are subject to all requirements set forth in these Rules.

12. The City is not responsible for: (i) computer system, hardware, software or program malfunctions or other errors, failures, or delayed computer transaction or network connection that affect the Contest or entrant's participation in it; (ii) lost, misdirected, illegible, intelligible, incomplete or late Entries; (iii) any act, failure to act, or delay regarding the transmitting or processing of Entries, or any technical delays in submission emails, Entries and/or uploads and updates; and (iv) any costs, losses, damages, or expenses arising by reason of accident, negligence,

printing, distribution, or production errors that may arise or occur in connection with this Contest.

14. This Contest is void where prohibited by law and is subject to all applicable federal, provincial, and municipal laws, regulations, and requirements.

15. The City is collecting personal information about entrants for the purpose of administering this Contest and as described in these Rules. No further informational or marketing communications will be sent to the entrant as a result of entering this Contest. Please see the [City's Privacy Policy](#) for information on its policies regarding maintaining the privacy and security of personal information.

16. The City has the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or modify the Contest at any time without notice in the event that, in its opinion, the holding of the Contest would be prevented for reason including but not limited to technical failure or breakdown, an unauthorized interventions, fraud or any other cause beyond the control of the City which would compromise the management, security, impartiality, integrity or smooth running of this Contest. The City has the right to interpret these Rules as required and its decisions are final.

17. Any and all disputes arising from the Contest will be resolved in the courts of the Province of Ontario and are subject to the laws of that Province.

The 5 types of cycling facilities include the following:

1. Bike lane

Bike lanes are the most common type of cycling infrastructure in Ontario. Guelph currently has 68 kilometers of bike lanes along most of the City arterial roads.



2. Multi-use path

A Multi-use path (MUP) is a pathway shared between people walking, cycling and using mobility devices. Guelph has 5.5 kilometers of multi-use paths.



3. Trail

The City has several kilometers of [beautiful trails](#) for you to explore.



4. Signed route

Signed routes direct people on bikes through quiet residential streets as an alternative to using bike lanes on major roads, or where bike lanes are not available. Guelph has over 14 of kilometers of signed routes.



5. Cycle track

A cycle track is a bike lane that is physically separated from vehicle traffic and from the sidewalk.



Disclaimer: Safety first! Never use a cell phone or camera while riding your bike. Once you've found the cycling facility you were looking for, step out of the roadway to capture your photo. Don't forget to always use lights at dawn and dusk and always wear a helmet.
